Sisters in the League:

November 30th is the first Sunday of Advent for 2025.

Advent—a season of preparation for Christ's first coming at Christmas and in anticipation of His promised second coming. It's a season that incorporates four themes: hope, peace, joy, and love.

- 2. The Pray More Advent Retreat at: https://praymoreretreat.org/ is a self-paced retreat with 4 speakers, 16 video and audio presentations and 16 study guides. This means that you can participate wherever you are and whenever you have the time. It's like a do-it-yourself retreat, but you're not doing it alone. The presentations are thought-provoking, relevant and up-lifting.
