Our participation in writing letters and creating resolutions can create social change.

Attached is a drafted letter to be sent to one or more of the Honourable Prime Minister or Member of Parliament or Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness about National Resolution 2025.01 regarding cybercrime and creating a national database to help fight technological crimes against Canadian citizens.

You may copy the letter "as is" and include your handwritten paragraph, or you may use this as a guide to write your personal letter. As a constituent, or a citizen of Canada, urge their action and request their opinion. Be sure to tell you look forward to their response and include your printed name and address, and signature.

Letters to MP's require no postage if sent to the Ottawa Parliament. Record the date you sent the letter and inform your executive. Your council executive records the issue topic, number of letters sent to each level of government, and responses received in their Annual Report. Save the responses to the CWL resolution. You are working on the Action Plan section of the resolution.
